## **Weight Restrictions** Lifted on Rt. 706 Span

PennDOT announced that it is removing the 32-ton and 40-ton-combination weight restric-tions on a bridge on Route 706 in

tions on a bridge on Route 706 in Stevens Township, Bradford County The bridge carries Route 766 over Cold Creek, about two miles northeast of Camptown. A PennDOT crew recently milled off a portion of the pave-ment on the bridge to lighten the dead load on the structure. In addition, the bridge is pro-grammed for replacement in 2015.

PennDOT advises motorists in the northern tier that the weight restrictions will soon be removed on Route 4016 (Campbellville Road) in Sullivan County bellville Road) in Sullivan Coun-ty, and Route 1001 (Clapper Hill Road), Route 2006 (Hollenback to Sugar Hill Road), Route 2009 (Ambrosious Road), Route 3004 (Hatch Hill Street), and Route 3008 (South Avenue/Southside Road) in Bradford County because of gas-company because of gas-company upgrades to the roads.
